- Current operations are firstworkings only (no secondary extraction).




PRODUCTION FORECAST



The forecasted mine design remains the same to previously presented in the Feb-22 CCC meeting.

Forecast coal production for FY21-22 was reduced from 1.5 million tonnes per annum (Mtpa) to 1.2 Mtpa.

Forecasted coal production for FY22-23 is back to 1.5 Mtpa.

Current status of the Consent Consolidation Project:


- Technical specialist reports and EIS being amended to account for the removal of the Eastern Mining Area (EMA).

Incident:	Faecal Coliform Exceedance at LDP27 (Spillway)				
Date:	• 30 March 2022				
Details:	Spillway breached on 30 March 2022 during high rainfall intensities. Sample collected during spillway breach as required under EPL 1770.				
	 Sample from LDP27 recorded 1,200 CFU/100ml of Faecal Coliforms, exceeding the limit of 200 CFU/100ml. A total of 33 kL was discharged via the spillway on the 30 March 2022. 				
There is likely a significant contribution to fat coliform concentrations brought into the dat system during high intensity rainfall from runwithin catchment areas.					
	 Upstream sampling indicated that the concentration of faecal coliforms in the stream was greater than the concentration within CVC discharge waters, likely due to the discharge of treated effluent from the Mannering Park Sewage Treatment Plant. 				









DEPOSITIONAL DUST – CHAIN VALLEY COLLIERY






DEPOSITIONAL DUST – MANNERING COLLIERY








PM₁₀ MONITORING

Note: annual average resets at calendar year.




PM_{2.5} MONITORING




Delta Coal utilises Delta Electricity's Beta Attenuation Monitoring (BAM) PM2.5 continuous monitor located in Wyee.

NOISE MONITORING CHAIN VALLEY COLLIERY Q4 2021



Chain Valley Colliery Q1 noise monitoring was undertaken on the 14th, 15th and 18th March 2022.

9 Locations are monitored during day, evening and night with timeframes in accordance with the NSW EPA's Noise Policy for Industry.

In Q1 2022, Chain Valley Colliery was inaudible at all monitoring locations, with exception to ATN007 (ventilation fan site). The maximum recorded result for each location is presented adjacent.



INDEPENDENT ENVIRONMENTAL AUDIT 2022



Independent audits were commissioned and undertaken in the reporting period by GHD (consultants). The focus of the audit is Delta Coals compliance with development consents and environmental licenses between 2019 and 2022, as well as, completion of previous audit actions.

The audits were undertaken for Chain Valley and Mannering Colliery's. The audits have not yet been finalised and recommendations and actions from the audit will be provided to DPIE with commitment from Delta Coal.
