Description of the development consents

SSD 5465 allows for the extraction of up to 2.1 million tonnes of underground run-of-mine coal per year using first workings methods until 31 December 2027. Transportation of coal from the site is limited to 660,000 tonnes per year for export and 180,000 tonnes per year for domestic use. Transport of coal is by either public or private roads or via an underground conveyor to Mannering Colliery and thence to Vales Point Power Station.

MP 06_0311 allows for the extraction of up to 1.1 million tonnes of underground run-of-mine coal per year using bord and pillar and longwall mining methods until 30 June 2022. Transportation of coal from the site is limited to 1.3 million tonnes per year.

Description of proposed modifications

Delta Coal is seeking to modify SSD 5465 to allow for:

- The transport of run-of-mine coal from Chain Valley Colliery to Mannering Colliery via the approved underground conveyors linking the two operations at a rate up to the annual extraction level approved under SSD 5465 (ie 2.1 million tonnes per year); and
- A change in the consent's definition of 'first workings' to allow a broader use of bord and pillar mining methods within the approved consent boundary.

Delta Coal is seeking to modify MP 06 0311 to allow for:

- An increase in the rate of run-of-mine coal handling at Mannering Colliery and transport via the overland conveyor from the Colliery to Vales Point Power Station, up to the approved extraction limit at Chain Valley Colliery;
- An extension to the approved end date for mining operations from 30 June 2022 to 31 December 2027, to align
 with the approved mining period of SSD 5465; and
- Allow for the use of alternate bord and pillar mine designs.
