

## OPERATIONAL UPDATE

Delta

- Mining production areas are currently in areas under Lake Macquarie, north of Frying Pan Bay / Summerland Point and south of Brightwaters.
- MWS5 commenced 12 April 2021
- The first bord and pillar panel (HB1) started 17 August 2020
- Forecast coal production for FY20/21 is 1.5Mt




Above: Workings February 2021 – April 2021 inclusive (pink)

- FY21-22 production forecast close to 1.5Mtpa



## NORTHERN MINING AREA (NMA) EXTRACTION PLANS



- Draft MWS5 and NMA Pillar Extraction Plan submitted to regulators and stakeholders (CCC) in December 2020
- Approved by DPIE in April 2021 with MWS5
- Extraction Plan and approval and associated management Plans added to DC website
- Additional subsidence monitoring being installed in Q3 2021 on Morisset Peninsula as per the NMA Subsidence Monitoring Program prior to under the lake pillar extraction in August 2021. Letter drop and door knock.






#### Phases of an Environmental Impact Assessment (EIA)

## CONSOLIDATION PROJECT ENVIRONMENTAL ASSESSMENT - RESULTS



Impact	Results
Subsidence	First workings in Eastern Mining Area GN seam - max 20mm subsidence in seagrass, foreshore and land
Noise and Air Quality	Initial modelling shows that it is expected to be consistent with existing operations




#### Subsidence Monitoring

Delta Coal submitted an Annual Subsidence report to the DPIE and Resources Regulator which was appended to the 2021 Annual Review, circulated to committee members and available on the Delta Coal website, deltacoal.com.au.

The Annual subsidence report details results of bathymetric scanning and foreshore subsidence monitoring for the 2020 period.

- No exceedances of maximum subsidence predictions (0.78M) were observed over Miniwalls S2-S4.
- Nil or negligible (<20mm) subsidence has been observed in foreshore monitoring.






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
## DEPOSITIONAL DUST -CVC



#### **CVC** Depositional Dust (12 month rolling average)




#### MC Depositional Dust (12 month rolling average)

## NOISE MONITORING RESULTS



#### **Chain Valley Colliery:**

 Noise monitoring undertaken quarterly, Q1 monitoring completed on the 24 and 25 May 2021. All monitoring locations were compliant, with CVC inaudible at all monitoring locations.

#### **Mannering Colliery:**

- Mannering Colliery monthly monitoring in February, March and April 2021 compliant with applicable noise limits;
- there have been no exceedances of noise monitoring results since the last exceedance at Kingfisher Shores prior to decommissioning of the Rotary Breaker (exceedance in May 2020). Modelling undertaken following the decommissioning indicated that in a worst case meteorological scenario, MC noise emissions observable at the MSHV monitoring location could be up to 39 dB(A) (LA<sub>eq15</sub>) while the modelled noise limit for the monitoring location is 40 dB (A).




#### 2020 Complaints

- 1 community complaints in 2020 for Chain Valley Colliery
- 40 community complaints in 2020 for Mannering Colliery, 39 of 40 complaints were made by one complainant regarding noise.

## DELTA COAL ENVIRONMENTAL PROJECTS

#### CVC PRP8






## DELTA COAL ENVIRONMENTAL PROJECTS
